



National Curriculum

As writers we will have a go at writing our own adventure stories using the book 'Paddington' as our inspiration. We will also write a shape poem about fire as we learn about the Great Fire of London. Finally we will write a newspaper report about the Great Fire of London using the story 'Toby and the Great Fire of London'.

As readers we will read stories such as 'Paddington', 'Town Mouse and Country Mouse' and 'Toby and the Great Fire of London'. We will use some of these as inspiration for our adventure stories and newspaper reports.

As mathematicians we will be looking at numbers to 10, number bonds, addition and subtraction.

As Scientists we will be learning about everyday materials, by looking at objects and the materials from which they are made. We will also begin to use scientific words when investigating.

As artists we will experiment using computer drawing software such as Tux Paint or Colour Magic to draw vehicles that could be found in London.

Possibilities

As people who have a thirst for learning, we will:

- Use sliders and levers to create a 2-D moving picture of a London vehicle.
- Design and make a moving model of the London Eye.
- Bake wholegrain bread rolls like the ones sold by Thomas Farriner on Pudding Lane.

As members of a community, we will:

- Learn about the Royal Family and their role both nationally and internationally.
- Begin to understand the importance of tourism in London and other places within the UK and the importance of this.

Adventure

As explorers, we will:

- Virtually explore the four countries that make up the United Kingdom.
- Learn positional and locational language to help us navigate a Beebot around a map of the UK.
- Make choices to control a model or simulations by programming a journey from the London Eye to Pudding Lane.
