



National Curriculum

As writers we will study Brazilian myths and legends before having a go at writing our own legend using 'The Crow's Tale'. We will also write a set of instructions to make a dish of Brazilian cuisine.

As readers we will read stories such as 'Jabuti the tortoise' and 'Two can Toucan'. We will use some of these as inspiration for our own writing.

As mathematicians we will be looking at length and height, numbers to 40 and addition and subtraction word problems.

As Scientists we will be continuing our work on plants, by identifying and describing the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants. We will also be learning about seasonal changes by observing and describing weather changes across the four seasons.

As artists we will be using coloured feathers to make our own headdresses for a samba parade. We will also create a collage using a variety of materials to depict a Rio de Janeiro carnival scene.

Possibilities

As people who have a thirst for learning, we will:

- Research and create our own instruments to play.
- Learn some Portuguese phrases and participate in conversations with our learning partner.
- Learn about celebrations in both the UK and Brazil by comparing and contrasting similarities and differences.

- Continue to become tolerant of different cultures by learning about the wildlife and tribes people within the Amazon rainforest to understand the importance of reducing deforestation.
- Develop mutual respect by learning about the wide spread poverty that affects many areas of Brazil.

- Compare and contrast life in Brazil to life in the UK.
- Use cutting and sticking skills to make small miniature flags of Brazil.
- Taste test a variety of Brazilian celebratory cakes.
