Pioneering

What activities will they do?

Bushcraft

Learn how to survive in the wild! From water-collection and filtering, to firebuilding and foraging.

Shelter-Build

A continuation of Bushcraft, work in teams to design and construct natural shelters in the woods.

Orienteering

Learn how to read a map, then navigate Woodrow's 26-acre grounds on the hunt for clues.

- Arrival back to school approx3.30pm


Groups
